I have seen positive performance throughout the Cocopah Tribe. With this type of productivity, it builds confidence. Here are some examples:

- Revenue increase at the Cocopah Casino for 2015.
- \* Revenue increase at the Cocopah Enterprises for 2015.
- Increase of High School student graduating. Resolution CT-2014-33.
- Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visitation (MIECHV) program awarded to Cocopah Tribe to be part of the First Things First Early Steps program. Program is going to expand for the tribe.
- Healing Journey program implemented for youth.
- The new IHS Healthcare Center has broken ground and is under construction.
- Incoming revenue projects- Verizon cell tower, Lamar billboard, and lease of property.
- Projects in the works- North Park, Kmart Building, Cryhouse bathrooms, CEDS completion, landfill closing, capital improvements, and the continued consultation with federal, state, county, and city governments.

With the many positives trends, still comes some negative. We all know that every issue is impossible to resolve, but let us start. What can we do today to help our community? Here are some examples:

- STOP GRAFITI on our tribal land! We as a community need to teach our children what is right and what is wrong. It is disrespectful. We need to take care of our tribal lands. Report it.
- Report illegal dumping on tribal land.
- Need to pay monthly \$11.50 for Water & Trash service. Elders pay \$9.50. These payments help in the cost of maintaining of equipment.
- Take care of pets. Make sure they have enough water and food, especially with the summer that is coming. Keep on leash to prevent accidents like bites.
- Continue to join in or volunteer for community events.

#### April 1st, 2016: Mashantucket Pequot Museum & Research Center Re-opens for the 2016 Season

The Mashantucket Pequot Museum & Research Center, a 308,000 square-foot complex part of the government of the Mashantucket Pequot Tribal Nation, is a non-profit educational institution that seeks to further knowledge and understanding of



the richness and diversity of the indigenous cultures and societies of the United States and Canada.

In 1637, the Pequots became the first native people to survive a genocidal massacre at the hands of European immigrants in what would become the continental United States. Pequot history is an unprecedented story of redemption and restoration, which is featured at the Tribe's world-class Mashantucket Pequot Museum & Research Center. 2016 promises to be rewarding and educational season for the Museum and visitors alike with a new digital exhibit on 'Dolls as Ambassadors of Native Culture' and Mishoons, Pequot dugout canoes.

# March 21st, 2016: Los Angeles City Council Committee takes a step toward establishing Indigenous Peoples Day.

The Arts, Parks and River Committee unanimously voted to approve a motion introduced by Councilman Mitch O'Farrell in November. The motion asks the city administrative officer to report back on how it would establish Indigenous Peoples Day as a legal holiday in the city

The motion under consideration is Item No. 15-1343, which reads in part:

"...Native Americans and their traditions inspire the ideals of self-governance and determination that are the framework of our Nation. There are significant contributions by Native Americans including agriculture, medicine, self-governance, music, language and art. In addition, there are globally recognized inventors, scholars, and spiritual leaders.

O'Farrell told the Los Angeles Times, "This is about righting one of the greatest slights that any ethnic group has ever had to endure."
