January 27 - The Cocopah and Quechan were both in attendance at the groundbreaking for the Ft. Yuma IHS Health Care Facility. Post 802 Color Guard posted the Colors at the beginning of the ceremony and Cocopah Elder Mr. Paul Soto said the opening prayer.

Both Nations' Councils took to the podium to speak, coming together to bless the foundation, release the balloons, and participate in singing and dancing before the closing prayer was said by Wanda Barton.

The 76,265 sq. ft. facility will incorporate the Indian clinical, dental, and optical health care needs of Southwest Arizona and California.



Agua Caliente Cultural Museum: January 19, 2016



The Agua Caliente Cultural Museum in Palm Springs, California recently opened a new exhibition *IndiVisible: African-Native American Lives in the Americas*, which was jointly curated by the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian and National Museum of African American history. The exhibition illustrates how the lives of Native and African people have been intertwined since the arrival of Christopher Columbus, even as these groups were oppressed and excluded from mainstream society. Their communities, relationships, and shared traditions

helped them to overcome their conditions and regain economic stability. The exhibition will be on view through November 1, 2016.
