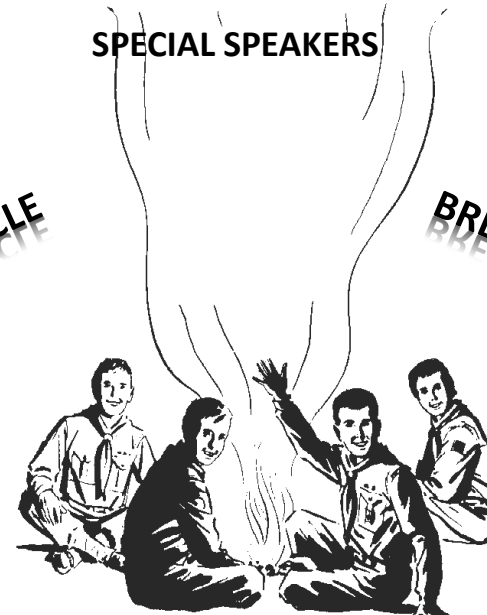

Listen Up!

Noises Can Damage Your Hearing

Sounds surround us. We enjoy many of them-like music, birdsong, and conversations with friends. But loud or long –lasting noises-from motors, power tools, and even headphones, can permanently damage your hearing. Take steps to protect your ears from harmful noises. Loud noises is one of the most common causes of hearing loss.

An estimated 26 million Americans between the ages of 20 and 69 already have irreversible hearing loss caused by loud sounds and up to 16% of teens have hearing loss that may have been caused by loud noise. For adolescents, music players with headphones are a common source of noise exposure. With adults, it may be power tools, lawn mowers, leaf blowers, and other sources of

that type. Noise –related hearing loss can arise from extremely loud burst of sound, such as gunshots or explosions which can rupture the eardrum or damage the bones in the middle ear. This type of hearing loss can be immediate and permanent. But most noise-related hearing problems develop slowly over time, with ongoing exposure to loud sounds. Loud noises can injure the delicate sensory cells, known as hair cells, in the inner ear. Make sure to wear eye protection such as ear plugs if the sound can't be avoided. Or just get away from the sound. Finally, don't forget to protect the ears of children who are too young to protect their own and get a hearing test if you think you or a loved one might have hearing loss.

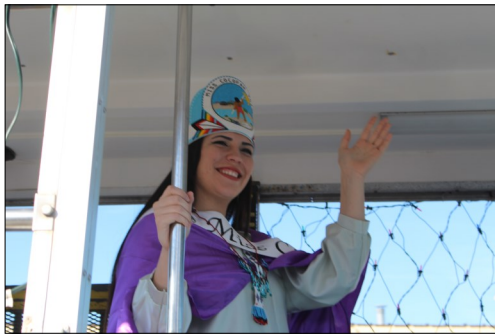

New Miss Cocopah Makes Her First Public Appearance In Rodeo Parade

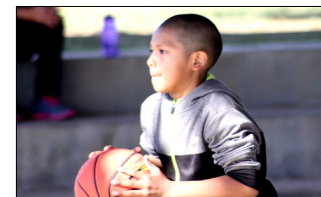

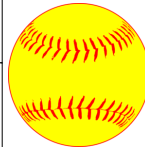

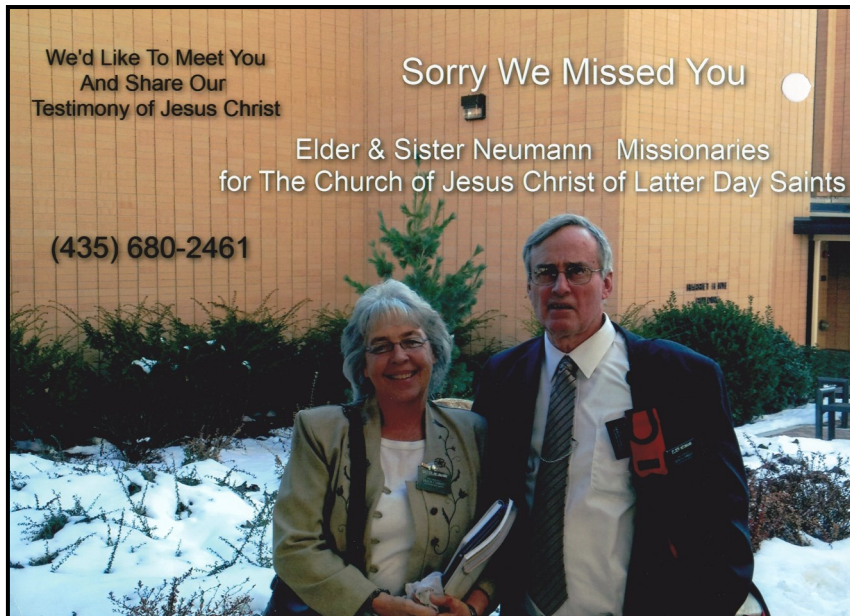
