Request for Proposals For Cocopah Wetlands East Irrigation Ditch and Pipe

April 2012

1. Project Summary

The Cocopah Indian Tribe is soliciting bids for the construction of an earthen and/or concrete irrigation ditch on the East Cocopah Reservation. The purpose of this irrigation ditch is to provide water for both a wetland park under construction and to the cultural ceremonial grounds.

1.1 Proposal Submissions

Proposals must be received by 5 PM, (Arizona Time), on Friday the 13th of April, 2012. Proposals will be accepted in person at 14515 S. Veterans Dr, Somerton AZ 85350 at the EPO office or via any courier or delivery service. No e-mail submissions will be accepted. All bids will remain sealed until the 16th of April 2012. The contract will be awarded on the 20th of April. The Cocopah Indian Tribe retains the right to not award a contract for this proposal and will reissue a RFP on the 20th of April. Work should be completed by the 25th of May 2012.

1.2 Proposal Process

Proposals should contain written responses to the Scope of Work (Section 2), and Insurance Requirements (Section 1.5). Additionally, all proposals should include a complete breakdown of costs and description of the service provided, such as:

All proposals will be reviewed and the contract will be awarded on April 20, 2012.

1.3 Equipment Requirements

The contractor should use equipment appropriate to effectively, efficiently, and safely perform the tasks associated with this project. A list of all proposed equipment to be used on the project shall be submitted with the proposal.

1.4 Health and Safety Requirements

Contractors must agree to abide by all OSHA regulations and safety requirements mandated by their insurance carrier(s).

1.5 Insurance Requirements

Prior to commencement of the work, Contractor shall procure, and at all times thereafter maintain with insurers acceptable to Cocopah, and having an A.M. Best's rating of A-VII or better, the following minimum insurance: Workers' Compensation ("WC") coverage to statutory limits required where the work is being performed and Employer's Liability ("EL") coverage f not less than \$1.000,000 each accident; Commercial General Liability ("CGL") of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate; CGL shall include coverage extensions for: (1) contractual liability, (2) products/completed operations, (3) X.C.U. hazards as applicable, and (4) independent contractors; Automobile Liability ("AL") of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident, covering "any auto" or covering all owned, nonowned and hired vehicles used in its operations. Contractor's insurance shall be primary and non-contributory to any other applicable insurance maintained by Cocopah. Contractor shall cause its CGL and AL to name The Cocopah Indian Tribe as an additional insured to the maximum limits of liability waiver of subrogation in favor of The Cocopah Indian Tribe. Contractor shall provide Cocopah with certificates of insurance establishing compliance with the above requirements prior to beginning any work under this contract. The certificates shall provide for thirty (30) days written notice to Cocopah in the event of policy cancellation. Contractor shall cause its subcontractors to procure and maintain the same insurance as outlined above. If requested to do so, Contractor shall obtain certificates of insurance from its subcontractors and deliver them to Cocopah.

2. Scope of Work

Engineering blueprints of the irrigation canal to be constructed are available for review at the Cocopah EPO office. Please contact Kendra Morton, 928-627-2025 x15 for an appointment to review these plans. The engineering plans specify a concrete lined irrigation ditch. We want all contractors to supply bids for doing the work in concrete as specified in the drawings as well as making it an unlined dirt ditch. In both cases the

underground pipe, associated grate and stonework for receiving water in the wetland park would remain unchanged.

Site visits can be arranged with the Cocopah EPO department and will be made on the 10th of April 2012. Please make an appointment while reviewing the blueprints.
